Reilley Rankin is known on the golf circuit as the "Comeback Kid" by many who have followed her career over the past several years. Last year, she secured one of the coveted few "exempt status" spots on the 2004 LPGA Tour by coming in 5th on the "Top Earnings" list of the FUTURES Golf Tour, which is the official developmental tour of the LPGA (Up until recently, it was the Top 5 earners who secured a spot; now it's the Top 10 who receive the exempt status.)

This was a pretty extraordinary triumph for Rankin, considering, in 1999, doctors told her she'd never play golf again after a life-threatening accident left her with a broken back in three places, a broken sternum down the middle, and the possibility of never walking again. While in the hospital during her rehabilitation period, Rankin never once considered the thought that she would not play golf again. The mind is a powerful thing, and during her year-long recovery period, she would practice her golf swing over and over again in her thoughts while walking on a treadmill. It would be a year after the accident before she picked up a golf club again.

When she secured the 1st place finish on the FUTURES Golf Tour in 2003 at Innsbrook Country Club in Northwest Indiana, she was well on her way to reaching her life-long dream of playing on the LPGATour.
